The University recently announced two major appointments. Marty de los Cobos, former CSUCI director of community, government, and alumni relations, has been named to the new position of vice president for University Advancement, responsible for developing networks, alliances, and friends throughout the community, as well as establishing relationships with elected officials at all levels. Deborah Wylie, former university architect for the California State University system, has been named associate vice president of Operations, Planning and Construction, in charge of all university design and construction projects, including the construction of the new Broome Library.

Trading Places in the Bell Tower Building

To better serve students, various Student Life offices within the Bell Tower Building have traded places. The offices of Career Development Services, Disability Accommodations, and Personal Counseling have relocated to the East Wing of the Bell Tower Building, in the offices formerly occupied this past semester by the Writing Center and CSUN faculty. EOP and University Outreach services have moved to the offices located between Conference Halls 1 and 2. Construction Report

- Student Housing: Significant on-site activity is still occurring, with furniture deliveries continuing throughout next week. The RAs are moving in now.
- Temporary Dining Commons: Renovation continues. The commons eating area is anticipated to open for the fall semester and will serve the campus for approximately two years while the permanent facility is remodeled. Completion of the kitchen and food preparation space will be completed November 1. Installation of equipment is being finalized and should be ready for food service next Friday, August 27.
- New Library Reading Room: This space is located at the interior northwest corner of the South Quad. Work has been put on hold for a few weeks to allow for all staff available to finish the dining commons project.
- Science Plaza: Site preparation for construction is imminent. The drain pipe excavation and installation will start the project, followed by excavation and recompaction of the underlying soil and base. Parking in the area might be impacted by the project. We will endeavor to keep the disruptions to a minimum.
- Several painting projects will take place in the coming weeks. Anticipate some disruption from the building of scaffolding and that some areas will be temporarily taped off-limits.
- Parking lot resurfacing and re-striping has been completed. Additional spaces were built near the Science Building and OPC in lot A5, with additional spaces for faculty and staff as well as three spaces for maintenance vehicles.

- University Glen Phase 3 construction continues to move at a good pace. The site is graded and ready to receive building pads, water, sewer, drainage, and other utilities. Construction vehicles are using Channel Islands Drive to enter University Glen. Please drive carefully in this area.
- Town Center construction activities continue. The foundations and the ground floor slabs have been poured. The project is now going vertical.
- Classrooms: Several of the campus classrooms are being converted to smart classrooms with the addition of IT and AV equipment to increase lecture delivery capabilities.
