

Student Academic Field Experience for Credit Liability Insurance Program (SAFECLIP)

General:

This insurance program provides general and professional liability coverage for CSU students performing community service or volunteer work for academic credit, as well as students enrolled in radio, television or film credential programs.

Coverage:

This program protects students, University and faculty from claims arising from real or alleged incidents that may occur while the student is participating in a service learning experience for academic credit.

This coverage may satisfy contractual requirements of the hosting entity, and mitigates the risks of claims and litigation against the student, faculty, the University and its community partners.

Eligibility:

To be eligible for this coverage, a student must be enrolled in a course for which professional liability coverage is required. A written placement agreement between the University and the hosting community partner is also required.
