Council Charge

The President's Council was instituted by the President in 2003 to ensure that every voice is heard and to facilitate interactive communication throughout the University. The Council, which meets monthly, is comprised of approximately 35 members representing students, faculty and staff from all campus divisions. Members are appointed to either position specific or rotating three year terms.


President's Council members participate in the shared governance of the University through an interactive process by bringing issues and ideas to the group for discussion and sharing information regarding campus activities and initiatives. In addition to generating new ideas, the President's Council reviews, develops, and recommends to the President University-wide policies to ensure campus safety and productivity.

In his charge to the President's Council, President Rush encourages members to talk with their colleagues, listen to their concerns and ideas, and bring these thoughts to the Council.

Policy Review and Development

The main responsibility of the President's Council is to develop and recommend campus administrative policies to the President. Policy development includes review and consultation not only by Council members and their respective divisions, but also the Academic Senate and bargaining units. President's Council agendas, minutes, and proposed policies are available for public review on the President's Council website. Once the Council recommends policies they are submitted to the President for approval. All approved policies are reviewed every three years to ensure that they meet the current needs of our growing University.


