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



Through a panel discussion, students have the opportunity to ask questions of individuals with extensive experiences in areas represented in Student Affairs. The panel consists of administrators that have selected a career in Student Affairs and/or spent a significant amount of time in the profession. In 2006, the panelists were: Dr.
