Overview

he primary goal of Academic Senate is to promote academic excellence. Shared governance is an essential aspect of the CSU system and lies at the heart of the Channel Islands campus. In the Fall of 2001, the Academic Senate was founded by the original 13 faculty members. Currently the Academic Senate is comprised of 70 tenured or tenure track faculty members, 2 representatives elected by the adjunct faculty, and a student representative. Ex Officio non-voting members include the University President, Vice Presidents, Associate Vice Presidents of Academic Affairs, and staff representatives.



The CSUCI mission is to provide students with an education that is interdisciplinary, that emphasizes multicultural and international perspectives, and includes both service and experiential learning. The

CSUCI Academic Senate serves as strong support of the university mission. Four centers have been approved by the Academic Senate to facilitate the fulfillment of the mission (The Center for Integrative Studies, The Center for Multicultural Learning and Engagement, The Center for International Affairs, and The Center for Civic Engagement and Service Learning). It is through the Academic Senate's standing and advisory committees that all academic programs, degree requirements, curriculum, faculty evaluation, and student academic policies are identified and established. The Academic Senate also has primary responsibility for the development of policies, making recommendations on academic matters to the campus president; and upholding the principle of academic freedom.
