
Overview

SUCI, in partnership with Johns Hopkins
University and California Lutheran
University, ran a five-week summer program
for high school students titled "What is
Engineering?" CSUCI was selected as one of five
universities to participate in the nationwide effort
by Johns Hopkins.




- The course introduced students, particularly women and minority students, to a career of engineering / technology.
- The majority of students came from Cal Lutheran's Upward Bound program, which was a residential program on CSUCI's campus.
- Other students came from our Ventura County high schools.
- Heather Williams from Foothill High School had the highest grade of the entire program.

Students learned through hands-on activities:



- Designed and built a better mousetrap.
- Measured height of Bell Tower remotely.
- Designed digital circuit to control a robot.
- Distilled ethanol.
- Tested thematerial propertiesof spaghetti.
- Responded to a Request for Proposals for a new medical device.




The students ended the course testing their spaghetti & epoxy bridges




President Richard
