EDUCATION PROGRAM SPECIAL COMMUNITY-BASED PROJECTS

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Early Assessment Project (EAP)

Early Assessment Project (EAP) offers high school students the opportunity to determine their readiness for college-level work in English and mathematics before entering the California State University (CSU). It provides support to teachers and counselors with ways to assist students with becoming more ready for university work.

University Preparation School

University Preparation School is a professional development school working in collaboration with CSUCI faculty and students. CSUCI students observe at the campus and learn about teaching from master teachers. Teaching methods classes are held at the school site.

Reading Institute for Academic Preparation (RIAP)

Reading Institute for Academic Preparation (RIAP) sponsored by the California State University system, assists teachers preparing for the California Standards Test and the EAP. Teachers work together on research-based projects for diagnostically assessing students and instructing them with effective practices.

Mathematics and Science Teacher Initiative (MAST)

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Family Literacy Project

Family Literacy Project is a collaboration between Hueneme Elementary School District and CSUCI. Faculty and students in a Liberal Studies capstone course work together with family members and students in the fourth and fifth grade on literacy skills



Early Intervention Skills Training

Early Intervention Skills Training provides teacher training opportunities to undergraduate students interested in pursuing a career in education with atrisk learners, including children from non-English speaking backgrounds. Students enrolled in a Liberal Studies capstone course work with children on early literacy skills under the guidance of a professor. (MAST) brings several projects together under one umbrella. MAST brings teachers, community college and county leaders together to determine how best to stimulate more interest in teaching. The program provides scholarships to students who are enrolled in mathematics and science education programs.

Introduction to Education

Introduction to Education is taught exclusively at local schools with high enrollments of students learning English as a second language. In this five year old partnership with Oceanview School district, students learn first hand how instruction is delivered to young students while tutoring the children and reflecting on their learning in seminar held at the school site.
