Easy tip for sending a bunch of photos at once, instead of one-at-atime:

On your computer (PC), make a new folder and put everything you plan to send into it. (You can copy & paste)

Once you're finished, Right-click the folder's icon, and select "Send To" > "Compressed (zipped) folder".

It will save a "zipped" file of your folder of photos, which you can now attach to an e-mail and send.

If your files are too large/your e-mail won't let you send it out:

We use the free website <u>www.yousendit.com</u> to send big files to each other, up to 100 MB.

Easy - just create an account, upload the whole zipped folder, and send to whoever you want.
