# The First Annual South El Monte High School Environmental Awareness/Career Day

#### **Fact Sheet**

### Who: South El Monte High School and the National Hispanic Environmental Council (NHEC).

South El Monte High School opened its doors in September 1992 and graduated its first class in June 1995. The school is located in the suburban community of South El Monte, California, at the southern end of the Emerald Necklace Loop. The beautiful Whittier Narrows Nature Center and Recreational Parks surround South El Monte High. South El Monte High School Staff and students have utilized these surroundings to "Go Green." Currently, we use reclaimed water for our irrigation system that earned us the Golden Water Pump Award by the Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District for leadership in water recycling. We also have student organizations that recycle aluminum cans and plastic containers daily. We have a fishing club that has partnered with Planet Green to recycle ink cartridges for financial support. We have also received an opportunity to work with The Southern California Consortium and United States Forest Service. This program will provide jobs, internships, and student exploration in the mountainous region of the San Gabriel Valley.

NHEC is a national, non-profit organization founded in 1996, with over 5,000 members, and located in Washington, D.C. **NHEC** is the only national Latino environmental organization in the country. NHEC seeks to educate, engage, and empower our community on environmental issues; provide a national voice for Latinos before federal, state, and green group decision-makers; and actively assist Latinos and minorities to pursue the many career, educational, and policy opportunities in the environmental and natural resource fields. We operate programs that fulfill this mission, and furthers our guiding credo: "because it's our environment too".

## What: The First Annual South El Monte High School-NHEC Environmental Awareness/Career Day.

The day will give South El Monte High School students an opportunity to learn about a wide variety of topics and careers associated with the environmental and natural resources fields. The event will feature exhibits by Los Angeles area environmental agencies (federal, state, city and county) as well as local green groups, corporations, and others. Students will follow their normal school day, with one period following another. However, during each period there will be classroom presentations by volunteer "role models" who will also assist teachers in discussing environmental issues and related careers. Elected officials and other key community leaders from across the district will also be invited to attend this event.

Many of the role models will be Latino/minority professionals, especially from the environmental arena, and recruited by NHEC. They will serve as mentors to the students, and by sharing their scientific expertise, career knowledge and life experiences with South El Monte students, they will help instruct and engage the next generation. Through the role models, students will have "their own" to be inspired by and interact with, and who have success stories to tell. This Career Day is one in a series under NHEC's national "High School Environmental Career Awareness Program."

## NHEC and South El Monte High School are seeking environmental professionals interested in volunteering to serve as role models at Career Day.

While many of the mentors/role models will be South El Monte High School Community or NHEC members, everyone is invited and welcome to participate in this event. Depending upon your availability, role models may participate in some or all of Career Day. Role models and exhibitors may also set up information tables, at no cost, with materials about their agencies or organizations. Parking will be available at the school.
