

CSUCI to Host Conference on Social Justice in Education

Camarillo, Calif., April 13, 2009 - The School of Education at California State University Channel Islands will host the Conference for Social Justice in Education, Saturday, April 25. The conference is scheduled from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and will feature a variety of speakers throughout the day in both the John Spoor Broome Library and Aliso Hall.

The conference is a gathering of Ventura County and statewide teachers and learners who will share, plan, discuss, question, compare, support and change what is done to achieve equity in schools. The day begins with registration and refreshments followed by a keynote speech and performances by prominent local educators. This will extend into a series of morning and afternoon sessions and conclude with a late afternoon performance by local students.
