Camarillo, Calif., Sept. 9, 2008-The CSU/CI Art Program presents "Truth is Stranger than Function," an exhibition featuring recent works created by the California State University Channel Islands Art Program faculty. The exhibition will begin Thursday, Sept. 11 and continue through Thursday, Oct. 30 at the John Spoor Broome Library on the CSUCI campus.

An artists' reception will be held at the John Spoor Broome Library from 6 to 8 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 18. The public is invited to attend.

Artwork on display will consist of works in painting, drawing, sculpture, ceramics, mixed media, photography, graphic design, costume design, digitally generated imagery, and video. The entire art studio faculty will participate in this exhibition, as well as art historians who will present scholarly works in an innovative context.

"This exciting exhibition presents the University community and Ventura County residents with the opportunity to view original, innovative artwork created by the accomplished CSU/CI art faculty. It will illustrate the diversity of the faculty through a wide range of artistic approaches, philosophies and media.
