Fall semester enrollment increase over last year

The fall 2007 semester begins on Aug. 27 with enrollment about 17 percent higher than fall 2006 numbers. More than 3,500 students are enrolled for the semester—with more than 500 first time freshmen. These figures were released by Jeff Savage, director of Admissions and Recruitment.

The former café is now a fully updated serving area, allowing Sodexho to provide a greatly expanded menu. A new dining room that seats 200 diners as well as a large patio and terrace overlooking the South Quad also were added, providing students and staff an outdoor gathering and dining space. Additional outdoor seating can still be found in the interior courtyard between Topanga Hall (the Art complex) and Islands Café.

Update from OPC

Operations, Planning & Construction at CSUCI have been busy working on campus improvement projects this summer. The following is an update on current projects issued by OPC.

BT East Courtyard Renovation

In an ongoing partnership with local labor unions, the Bell Tower East Courtyard is currently being renovated into a fully ADA accessible pedestrian courtyard. It will also provide an outside brick patio that can be utilized as an outside classroom. The construction labor is being donated by the unions and materials and monetary donations from the local community will complete the work.

BT East Second Floor Renovation

In a fast-tracked project, over 30 faculty offices were added into the last unoccupied space within the Bell Tower. The space has been completely renovated including new energy efficient lighting and double glazed windows designed to reduce long term energy costs.

John Spoor Broome Library

The 140,000 square foot Broome Library continues to move forward on schedule and will open to the public in time for the spring 2008 semester in January. This new digital teaching library will provide large bookstack spaces designed to accommodate all current and future publications, reading rooms, study areas, computer labs, a café, and a grand reading room. The front plaza includes a large water feature and vistas overlooking the main campus mall to the west. The east side of the library features a bridge to the University Glen Town Center and will provide direct library access to the neighboring residential community.

Dining Commons Expansion

During the past five months, the existing Islands Café was completely remodeled and expanded into an adjacent unoccupied space. The former café is now a fully updated serving area, allowing Sodexho to provide a greatly expanded menu. A new dining room that seats 200 diners as well as a large patio and terrace overlooking the South Quad were also added, providing students and staff an outdoor gathering and dining space.

Disability Accommodations Services

In a response to ever-expanding accommodations needs for the campus, the former bookstore location has been renovated into a new facility for Disability Accommodations Services, nearly tripling the square footage of the original DAS space. The new space provides private testing rooms, semi-private testing carrels, student work space, new offices as well as a lounge area for students using the facility.

Finance unit Bell Tower Renovation

The first phase of the Finance & Administration move to the Bell Tower has been completed on the first floor of the Bell Tower East. This project provides new office space for seven Finance staff members as well as a new conference room. The second phase, scheduled to commence after Disability Accommodations Services has vacated its current space will add space for an additional 13 Finance staff members. This project has been successfully constructed by the OPC staff.

Hub Parking Lot

By working with the Construction Battalion Center-Seabees from Naval Base Ventura County, a new parking lot was constructed behind the Hub, adding more than 300 parking spaces to the campus inventory. The parking lot has new lighting and emergency Code Blue telephones for safety.

Sage Hall Signage Improvements

In an ongoing effort to meet ADA compliance, all interior office and directional signage in Sage Hall has been replaced. Not only are the new signs ADA compliant, they also provide simple text replacement panels, greatly reducing future signage costs in the building.

Santa Cruz Village Student Housing

Several formerly unoccupied buildings were completely renovated and expanded along Ventura Street across from Anacapa Village into the second phase of student housing. This new phase of student residences adds more than 450 beds to the University's current capacity of 360 beds at Anacapa Village. Many of the new bedroom suites have fantastic views overlooking the South Quad. The facility also includes computer rooms, lounges, a dance room and an array of other public spaces for students.

South Quad Lighting Improvements

The University has started work on the South Quad lighting project, which will improve the safety within the South Quad as well as utilize energy efficient lighting, reducing campus energy costs. The new lights are also designed to meet or exceed CSU requirements for eliminating all light pollution into the night sky.
