Stepping out at 90

When Ginny Sims stepped out to celebrate her 90th birthday on Feb. 5, her friends and family gasped. That first step was out of an airplane 10,000 feet above Camarillo. Ginny chose to skydive to mark the day!

Eight decades of life is nothing to ignore, and she wanted to do something special. A magazine ad caught her eye: Skydiving! That's it, decided this longtime LV resident. She never looked back.

The adventure began at

Camarillo Airport at Skydive Coastal Company, where Ginny was strapped into a harness with her instructor Brendon (who has 6,800 jumps to his credit) and boarded the airplane. At an altitude of two miles, the door opened, and they stepped out into a 120 mph freefall.

"I put my head up and my arms out," Ginny said. They dropped away from the plane for 30 seconds. The chute opened at 5,000 feet, and they floated above Camarillo,



Pet Corner: Check that breath

Have you smelled your pet's breath lately? Some of you may be in for an unpleasant surprise.

Bad breath can indicate disease of the gums and teeth, and these problems can lead to mouth pain and infection in other parts of the body. Do your part to keep your pet's mouth clean and healthy. This will save you a lot of money in the long run. Consider brushing your pet's teeth daily.

If your pet allows you to touch the

inside of its mouth, you will probably be able to brush its teeth, but if your pet doesn't like you around its mouth, do not force the issue.

You can start with a soft cloth and pet toothpaste. Slowly graduate to a finger toothbrush or regular pet toothbrush. Also, there are many brands of tartar control treats on the market and at the veterinary clinic that aid in good oral hygiene.



Association rules can make Village sale tricky proposition

If and when you consider selling your home in Leisure Village, our Leisure Village Association has some tips that you should know before you list your property.

The primary goal of our Association and the Building & Grounds Committee, as well as the Architectural Committee, is the safety and appearance of the Village.

Any changes made to the outside of our homes requires a permit.

Any structural change requires a City of Camarillo building permit.

For wood fences that abut Leisure Village Drive or Mountain View Drive, upon sale of the residence, our Association rules require that the fence must be replaced or money will be held in escrow for no more than

90 days after the close of escrow, at which time the buyer must complete the installation of the new replaced fence.

The only approved planter bed edging is concrete or brick in mortar.

Indoor-outdoor carpet is no longer allowed at front entrances, only in enclosed patios with a proper architectural permit.


All improvements on the property are checked to be sure that permits are on file. If missing, the owner or agent must obtain one.



Leisure Village and Somis for about five minutes.

"It was beautiful," she recalls.

As Brendon recorded the jump on video, they drifted gently down toward the landing point in a Somis field where a dozen fans and family watched the descent. The touchdown was perfect: Ginny and Brendon walked to a stop. The welcome group cheered.

"I did it!" shouted the 90-year-old skydiver. "What a thrill! I never felt scared."

Ginny Sims describes herself as "always a daredevil since I first got roller skates at age six."

She was an aviation mechanic in the Navy during World War II and a race car driver in the 1950s and '60s.

"The fastest I ever drove was 163.4 mph," she laughs. For that feat, Ginny was awarded a trophy as the Fastest Woman of 1959 by the Southern California Sports Car Club.




Regarding human food, never give a dog chocolate because that can be fatal. Be very careful about giving a dog food that contains onions, garlic (one clove to 10 pounds of dog can be tolerated), grapes, raisins, macadamia nuts, avocados, broccoli, chives, rhubarb, coffee, tea or tomatoes. These can cause stomach upset.

The insecticides used in the gardens or on the side of the roads can cause irritation. Be aware when these are used, and keep your dog on






