Village elects new board of directors

Shown from left are General Manager Bob Scheaffer, Bob Ellis, Jerry Rosen, Lin Grant, John Mayer and Don Marquardt. Incumbents Rosen and Marquardt were re-elected with 886 votes and 864 votes respectively. Ellis, with 703 votes, joins as the new member of the board. The remaining candidates' votes were Bob Riveles, 496; Lynne Holmes, 205; Robert Kulick, 109; and write-in Al Fox, 26. A working board session to elect officers immediately followed the Thursday, June 23, election results, with Jerry Rosen re-elected president; Lin Grant, vice president; John Marquardt, treasurer; John Mayer, secretary; and Bob Ellis, director-at-large.

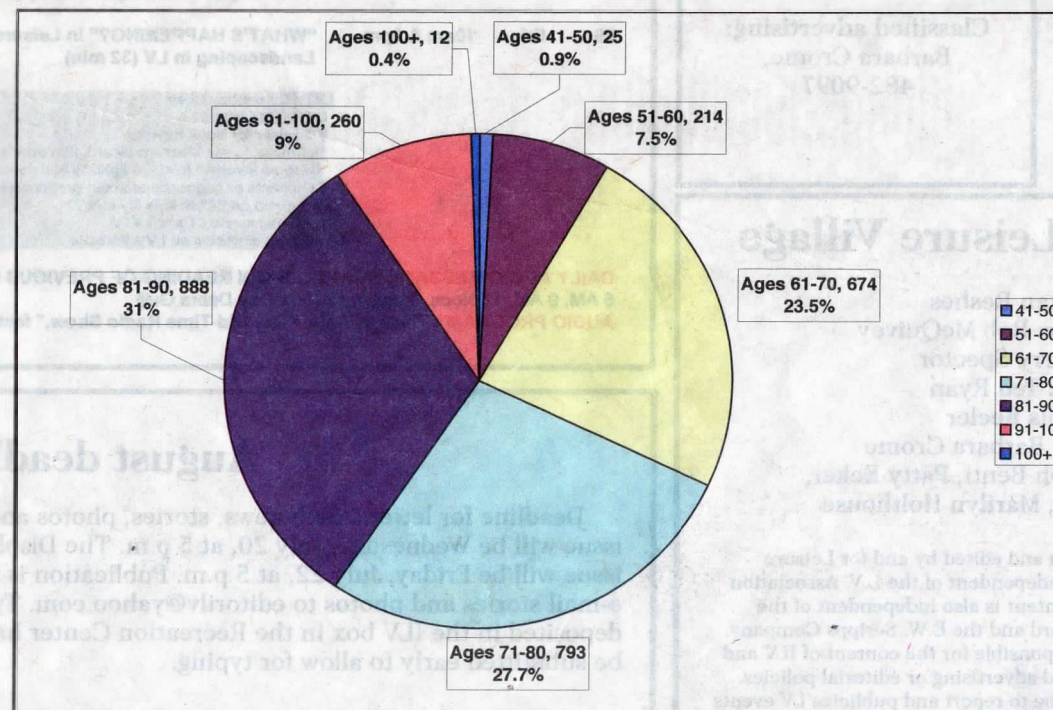
At Leisure Village age is all relative

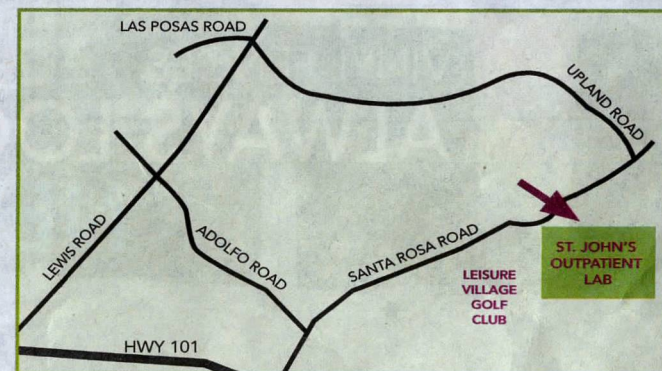

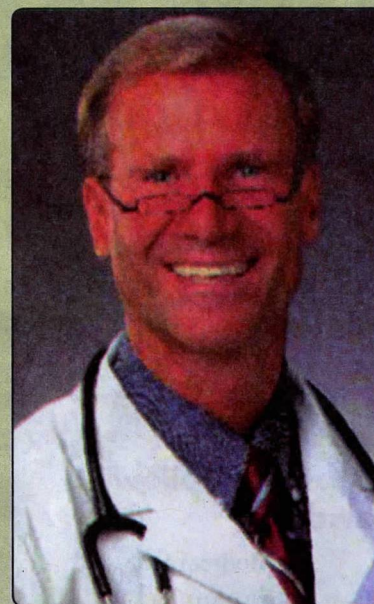

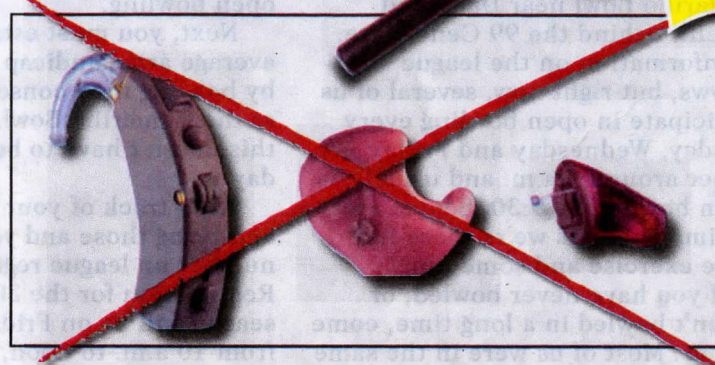

Information on the league follows, but right now, several of us participate in open bowling every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. We gather around 9 a.m. and usually begin bowling by 9:30. Scores are not important as we're there for some exercise and some fun.

If you have never bowled, or haven't bowled in a long time, come join us. Most of us were in the same boat when we started.

Now, about the Leisure Village Bowling League. It is a mixed handicap league with two men and two ladies per team and is for LV residents only. We bowl every Friday morning with practice at 9:30 a.m. and the league beginning at 9:45. It is a non-sanctioned league, and while we abide by most USBC rules, we do a little "customizing."

The intent of the league is to have fun and to enjoy the camaraderie of fellow Villagers. To assure peace and tranquility, husbands and wives are not allowed on the same team.

Teams are established by the league according to averages.

How do you join? The first step is to visit Harley's Camarillo Bowl. Tell the person at the desk you are

joining the Leisure Village League. You will then be given an I.D. number and that will qualify you for our special rate of \$2 per game for open bowling.

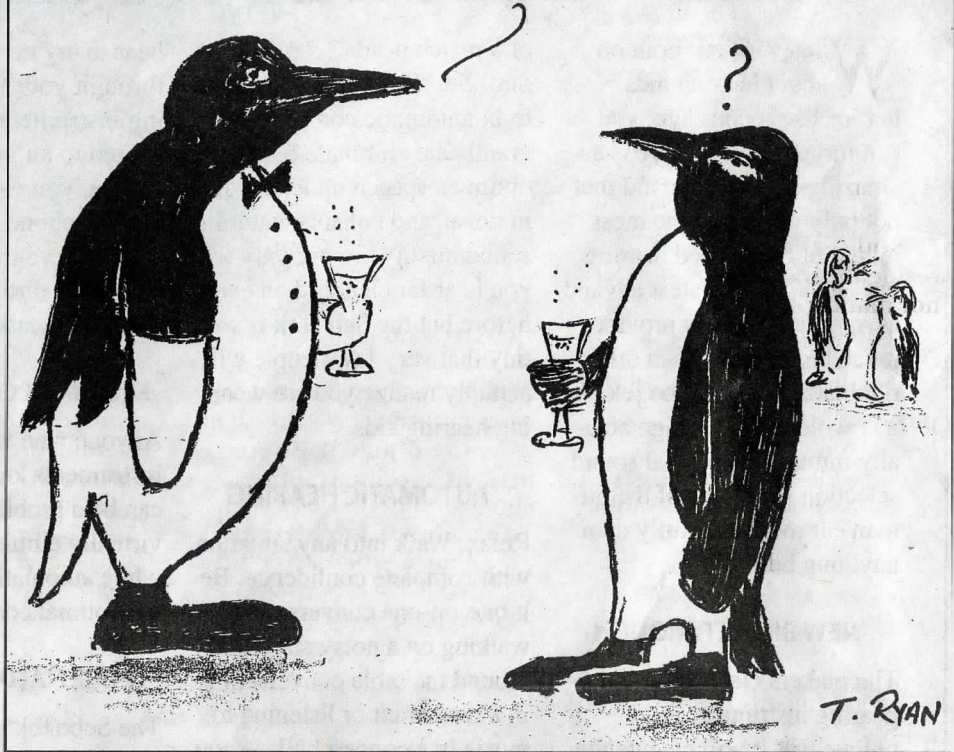
Next, you must establish an average and handicap. This is done by bowling nine consecutive games at the Camarillo Bowl. Obviously, this doesn't have to be done in one day.

Keep track of your scores, and bring those and your I.D. number on league registration day. Registration for the 2011-2012 season will be on Friday, August 12, from 10 a.m. to noon, in the MPR. The season begins on Sept. 9, 2011, and ends on April 27, 2012. If you cannot commit for each week, we welcome substitute bowlers that can fill in for absentees. It costs \$10 per person to join and \$9 per week for bowling. These fees pay for your bowling, the bowling banquet on May 12, 2012, and the balance is returned in prize money.

Except for this issue, there is a LV Bowling column under Club News every month with news and information.

VILLAGE HAPPENINGS

New club deals with aging process

A new club, presently titled "Save Our Sight and Hearing," is growing here in Leisure Village. It is presently finalizing its organizational structure, and, of course, searching for people to assume light duties. Meetings are held every Thursday at 1 p.m. in the Sun Room, excluding the first Thursday of each month. Attendance is open to Village residents and membership is not mandatory.

Although operating under the auspices of the Braille Institute, our purpose is not confined to low vision. Our aim is to explore all of the resources available through the Braille Institute that address age-related disabilities, not only blindness. Although other senses can substitute for the

loss of one function, these senses do not automatically take over. They must be specifically trained to fit the purpose. To this end, the club offers speakers and discussions designed to help members develop strategies to prepare and train themselves to face such changes; to find assistance to help with the difficulties; to keep up with developments in treatment as well as mechanical and technical devices; and to share the information with others.

On the third Thursday of each month representatives from the Braille Institute present specific training classes related to our goals. The membership presents programs for the other meetings. To date we have presented discussions on the

effect of the beauty of nature, psychological effects of the difficulties of aging, diet and exercise, and one of our local doctors lectured on the aging process.

In the near future we have scheduled similar discussions with doctors in other fields of medicine, financial planners and home arrangement and safety experts.

Since the most important of the physical losses we will encounter is in the brain, which directs all the senses, we are exploring every resource we can find to assist the brain to reconstruct its connections. With this in mind, we have scheduled the director of the Alzheimer's Association of America, who will speak on the prevention and postponement of dementia-related disorders.

I am absolutely crazy about the new seedless watermelons. I can't get enough, especially when those little "personal" ones that used to be about five bucks each are now at the 99 Cent Store! These little beauties are easy to carry and to slice. Usually I open one, cut it into bite-size chunks, and leave in the fridge for constant snacking.

There I found this recipe for Watermelon Salsa, and since I love Mango Salsa, I gave it a try. Yum! Use the measurements as a guideline only — a little more or less won't matter. I love cilantro. My sister hates it and uses mint instead. You can also experiment with cantaloupe or honeydew.

This is refreshing as a summer side with grilled chicken or meat.

Ingredients

4 or more cups of seedless watermelon, chopped into small

pieces

1 cup seedless cucumber, chopped into small pieces

½ cup scallions, green & white parts, chopped into small pieces

½ large yellow pepper chopped into small pieces

1 or more large jalapeno peppers, seeded, finely minced (Do not touch the seeds with bare hands!)

1-2 Tbsps. cilantro, fresh, minced

2 Tbsps. lime juice (or lemon)

1 tsp. of sugar or Splenda (or more to taste)

Pinch or two of salt

Instructions

Toss all ingredients together in large bowl. Serve chilled or at room temperature. At ½ cup per serving, the above makes 12 servings. If you make this ahead of time, chop up and toss the melon veggies and herbs and chill. Add sugar or Splenda and lime juice just before serving.

Remote-control car locks vulnerable

(Editor's note: This information was confirmed by Manny Segovia, head of security for Leisure Village.)

I locked my car. As I walked away I heard my car door unlock. I went back and locked my car again three times. Each time, as soon as I started to walk away, I would hear it unlock again!

Naturally alarmed, I looked around and there were two guys sitting in a car in the fire lane next to the store. They were obviously watching me intently, and there was no doubt they were somehow involved in this very weird situation.

I quickly chucked the errand I was on, jumped in my car and sped away. I went straight to the police station, told them what had happened,

and found out I was part of a new and very successful scheme being used to gain entry into cars.

Two weeks later, my friend's son had a similar happening.

While traveling, my friend's son stopped at a roadside rest to use the bathroom. When he came out to his car less than five minutes later, someone had gotten into his car and stolen his cell phone, laptop computer, GPS navigator, briefcase — you name it.

He called the police, and since there were no signs of his car being broken into, the police told him he had been a victim of the latest robbery tactic.

There is a device that robbers are using now to clone your security code when you lock your doors on your car

using your key-chain locking device.

They sit a distance away and watch for their next victim. They know you are going inside the store, restaurant or bathroom and that they now have a few minutes to steal and run. The police officer said to manually lock your car door by hitting the lock button inside the car. That way, if there is someone sitting in a parking lot watching for their next victim, it will not be you.

When you hit the lock button on your car upon exiting, it does not send the security code. But if you walk away and use the door lock on your keychain, it sends the code through the airwaves, where it can be instantly stolen.

This is very real.

\$35,000 boost for home healthcare

The Martin V. & Martha K. Smith Foundation has awarded Livingston Memorial Visiting Nurse Association \$35,000 to provide home healthcare for the sick, handicapped, elderly and homebound residents of the Oxnard plains. The funds will be made available for patients who are indigent, without insurance or with only Medi-Cal.

The Smith Foundation grant was made in recognition that the overall need for subsidized home healthcare is on the rise, driven by a lagging economy, high rates of unemployment and more uninsured. As a consequence, Livingston's Subsidized Care Program has experienced a four-year trend of skyrocketing demand. The number of indigent patients Livingston provided care for more than doubled from 186 in 2007 to 389 in 2010. Need for that care is highest in the Oxnard area.

Age is only a number, as Super Seniors prove

constantly changing as documented through frequent amendments in the Association Information Forms (AIF), records recently updated and summarized by staff, and subsequently provided to ILV by General Manager Bob Scheaffer suggest that of the 2,896 residents inhabiting our community at the present time, the average age of residents is 76.3 years with the median being 76.8, meaning that 50 percent are younger than 76.8 and 50 percent older.

Even more interesting is the fact that 46 percent of our residents are between the ages of 76 and 90, and if the records are accurate, 12 are 100 or older with the oldest being 103.

Although not directly comparable because of slight differences in the methodology used in collecting the data, information from a similar survey conducted in 2007 suggests

that the average age of residents four years ago was 77.25, not statistically different than that of 2011.

While some surmise that newer residents are comprised of younger aged seniors, and that the average age will drop over time, overt observations and limited records indicate that such is probably not the case.

Examples of active super seniors in our community include the following:

- Of 80 bowlers in the Leisure Village Bowling League, seven are 90 or older and include Ernie Slobotsky, age 96, who not only once owned two bowling alleys, but also occasionally attends the Saturday night dances with his wife, Ali.

- Golfers include Edith Dowsing, age 95, who speaks with an English accent for good reason and moved to our community in 1975; and Joe Silver, age 96, who also claims to play (golf) once a week with three lovely ladies on a regulation golf course outside the Village.

- Racquet sports enthusiasts include Roy Poders, age 90, whose first love is baseball but retired to the court because of two knee replacements; and Ginnie Dunnion, age 92, who was the first to play paddle tennis on the new courts in 1975. Although Kay Bell no longer wins the local tennis tournaments as in days gone by, at the young age of 86 she continues to rule the home courts against most younger aged players.

The Leisure Village Sportsman of the Year Award, however, must necessarily go to Ray Cass, who at the comparatively young age of 90 bowls three times a week, plays golf three times a week and competes in paddle tennis four times a week.

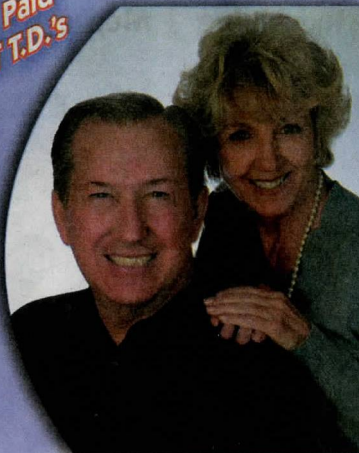
