Seniors drivers can get car checkup Aug. 11

A first-of-its-kind program that could make a lifesaving difference to older drivers will be presented Saturday, Aug. 11, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. outside the Recreation Center.

A safety program for senior motorists checks how well drivers and their personal vehicles work together. Developed through a collaboration of the American their vehicle, recommend Society on Aging, AAA, AARP and the Occupational Therapy Association, CarFit is the first program to offer adults 55 years and older the opportunity to check how their personal vehicles "fit" them.

Trained professionals will lead senior drivers through a 12-point checklist with

personal vehicle adjustments and adaptations and offer community-specific resources and activities that could make their personal vehicles "fit" better or enhance their safety.

An occupational therapist also will be on hand to provide information to older drivers on how to maintain

and strengthen driving health.

Because of the time allocated for each vehicle, it is estimated that there will be time only for approximately 24 cars and their drivers to be evaluated. It is imperative that residents wishing to participate make an appointment in advance by calling Al Schwartz at 482-4299. There is no charge.

LV resident has 50 plays, 9 movies to her credit

From a start in communist Poland. Teresa Watras finds success in U.S.

Let's backtrack in the life of Teresa Watras.

Now she lives in Village 39, portrayed Aunt Alicia in the recent LV production of "Gigi" and loves spending time with her grandchildren.

Pretty typical for an LV grandma who moved to Camarillo specifically to be close to her son, who lives in Moorpark with his family.

What is not typical were Teresa's previous moves, which were lonely and frightening because she was trying to leave communist Poland when the borders were closed to all but a handful of citizens.

It was the early 1960s. Life in Poland was dark and difficult. While the Polish

papers reported that the economy was good, store shelves were empty of everything from bread to bed sheets. Shoppers lined up for hours before dawn in the hopes of buying a few staples. Teresa lived with her parents in Warsaw; she was in law school to satisfy her lawyer father.

"I always wanted to be an actress, ever since I was 5 vears old when my dad took me to a play," Teresa recalls. "So just before my last year in law school, I quit and got a job at a theater, first as a page, then as an extra."

She never looked back.

Teresa Watras became a well-known actress in Poland with 50 plays and nine movies on her resume.

She describes life under the communist regime as "against human nature. You could never express your personal opinions. Yet, ironically,


The next step is to establish an





Realtors who specialize in Leisure Village are often called to talk to families about making a decision to lease or sell a parent's home. This is an important decision, and good information will help.

Selling a home will require a Comparative Market Analysis to determine current market value with and without upgrading. The house will need to be cleared of all personal property, and a Realtor can assist with what upgrades — painting, flooring, lighting, etc. — will help to get the house sold more quickly and for the best price possible. In some cases, an "as is" sale may be the best decision. The Realtor will review closing costs to help determine the seller's probable net proceeds.

The Leisure Village Association will do an exterior inspection of the property, and some corrections may be required. The homeowner/landlord will usually pay the monthly association fee, property tax and any upgrading or maintenance of the property. The family may choose to have a Realtor property manage and/or assist in finding a qualified tenant.

Village resident turns 100

They say that the first 100 years are the hardest, and Leisure Village resident Manny Shultz is about to find out.

Manny, an original owner in Village 42, celebrated his 100th birthday on July 25.

A lot of things have happened to Manny during those 100 years. Born in Czarist Russia, Manny's father was a successful cabinetmaker and real estate owner. Although not wealthy, the family was solidly middle class, an accomplishment for the times.

Life was good, except for the times when the pogroms occurred. During one of them, the family was forced to live in the cellar for two weeks, so, in 1924, they packed up and headed for America. Getting there was to be an adventure in itself. They were held up in Poland for many months as a minor border dispute caused problems. The family had sewed all of their silver into Manny's sister's dress to hide it from thieves and thieving border guards. After many months and many more bribes, they made it to Belgium and a ship heading to New York City.

Manny didn't stay long in New York — only a few weeks at an aunt's place — before heading to Los Angeles.

Life in America was good, and Manny married Myrtle and quickly settled into the American dream, only to have it interrupted by World War II. But even there, he was fortunate in that he joined the Coast Guard and was stationed in San Pedro.

After the war, he resumed his civilian life driving a truck for a laundry firm and raising his three children until, when he was 60, he decided to retire and start a new career as a dental technician. He graduated dental technician school in 1975 at the age of 63, but before he could get his own business going, a close friend became very ill and Manny was drafted into his jewelry manufacturing business. Five years later, his friend decided to sell the business, giving Manny the excuse he needed to retire again, this time for real.

At that point, Manny and Myrtle found Leisure Village and bought into Village 42, where he remains today.

During his tenure at LV, Manny has been very active enjoying golf, with six holes-in-one to his credit, and playing poker. His hobbies include making stained glass and woodworking, many examples of

theater and the arts were promoted."

So she was busy acting.

A theatrical agent saw her perform and invited her to work in Chicago, which had a large Polish population. She had no problem getting a passport, and off she went.

"I worked a lot and eventually got a part in 'The Solid Gold Cadillac,' starring Imogene Coco and Marie Wilson," Teresa recalls. "I performed all over the U.S. and Canada."

But there was a problem.

She hadn't seen her young son Martin for three years. He had stayed in Poland with her parents and his father. Polish authorities would not permit him to join Teresa, and her visa had expired. If she returned home, her father told her she would be jailed.

After an arduous campaign of letters, pleas and official requests, the refusals mysteriously ended. On Dec. 8, 1969, Martin, then 13 years old, arrived at LAX. Life was different for both of them. Teresa worked close to home; acting took a back seat. Martin became fluent in English within months. He's now a lawyer.

"I am very happy here," Teresa says about her life in Leisure Village. "I'm meeting such nice people and I love The Players Guild. I'm an American citizen. I tell my grandchildren what I learned from life: When you have a goal, go for it, no matter what!"

Village gardens yield plentiful harvests this time of year

For obvious reasons many of the folks in Leisure Village avoid any connotation associated with the word "plot," so the farmers in our community refer to their sacred ground as "garden patches."

The story begins shortly after 1973 when a few of the residents wanted to grow their own vegetables, but others were concerned that the food would attract mice, rats and other vermin. The compromise reached at the time prohibited the activity at individual homes and thereafter restricted the growing of food crops to an area east of the pavilion now known as the Farmer's Gardens.

By 1994 the Farmer's Club became official, the area was fenced, the land divided into

103 individual sites and some restrictions in the form of rules and regulations added (see pages 127-128 in the phone book). Locks were installed on the gates in 1999 simply because vermin other than rodents were sampling (stealing) the ware (particularly tomatoes) with uncanny regularity. A security phone was subsequently installed a few years back after more than one unsuspecting gardener was locked inside the compound.

Fast-forward to the present day and we see Norm and Debbie Chapman's sunflowers rising high above the fence and clearly visible from the tennis courts.

John and Sunshine Peterson's corn crop is almost tall enough to require a ladder for harvesting.
