
The key to most residents is the security that exists in the Village. But the lifeblood of the Village is the clubs and the various committees. There are approximately 65 clubs here.

LV's chess king Ed Colbert: a humble giant among men

Dr. Ed Colbert, a renowned psychiatrist and an international humanitarian and a resident of Village 20, passed away recently. He is survived by his wife, Mary Dady, seven children, four stepchildren, and 14 grandchildren.

Ed was a man of intellect, passion and integrity. His seemingly limitless energy and ability to make things happen will continue to be an inspiration for all of those who had an opportunity to work with him. He was a caring and humble man and rarely talked about his accomplishments, which could easily fill the lives of many men, not just one. There were never enough hours in a day for Ed; he was

always on the move!

At the age of 16, he graduated from high school as class valedictorian and then attended one year of college before enlisting in the U.S. Navy. While serving, Ed became fascinated by the miraculous recoveries of extremely shell-shocked servicemen, leading to his interest in the field of mental health. He returned to college and received his bachelor's degree, then graduated from Marquette University School of Medicine and took up residency in psychiatry at UCLA.

Ed began his medical career in 1959 as director of the Xavier Clinic at St. John's Hospital in Santa Monica. After opening a private practice in 1967, he published the first ar-

ticle on the use of lithium in the treatment of bipolar disease for the American Medical Journal.

Ed was an outstanding communicator in his field, which led to regular appearances at community meetings, editorial work for medical newsletters, university lecture engagements, a guest speaker appearance on television, and offerings of leadership roles in prestigious associations, organizations and boards. He was president of the National Guild of Catholic Psychiatrists, the Los Angeles County Medical Association and the Los Angeles County Catholic Physicians' Guild, and he was a member of the Campaign of Human Development.

After his retirement in 1993, Ed moved to

Ventura County and redirected his energies to humanitarian projects and public health affairs. He contributed countless volunteer hours to many organizations. He was chairman of the Bioethics Program, Los Angeles and Ventura Health Care Associations, a member of the Republican Ventura Central Committee, Rotary International and Board of Directors at St. John's Seminary.

He was recruited for Catholic 3rd Order of the Knights of Malta.

His love of children prompted him to direct his energy and resource-fulness to the RAIN Project, a facility that provides a home for Ventura County's homeless. With the help of the Rotarians and a playground

equipment company, a playground was built for the children living in the RAIN Project. Around Christmas of each year, Ed collected and personally delivered hundreds of shoes to Mexican orphanages. His community work earned him the Camarillo Senior Citizen of the Year award in 2007.

His notable contribution to Leisure Village was the foundation of the Outdoor Chess Club, which brought another new beneficial activity to our community. He continued to promote the club's activities within LV and Camarillo and wrote the Chess Club column for Inside Leisure Village until his untimely demise.

He will be missed by all his friends and many Ventura County residents whose life he enriched!

Bits from the LVA Board

Here is a rundown of the action taken by the Leisure Village Association Board of Directors during its Oct. 6 meeting:

Rule number 19.13, allowing political signs to be placed in the windows of private residences, was amended by the board in order to be consistent with state law.

The board approved the design and location for two benches donated by Inside Leisure Village to be placed along Mountain View Drive.

The board supported preliminary recommenda-

tions to amend the rules for use of the swimming pool and submitted the proposed ruling to homeowners for the required 30-day review period.

The board approved a request by 18 homeowners to establish a new club in the Village to be known as the Boosters Club.

The board approved an allocation of up to \$1,300 to be used in conjunction with donated funds for the purchase of a fiber optic curtain and controller to be used on the stage in the AR

These days many of us are saving money by not going out to eat as often. That doesn't mean you can't have your restaurant favorites. Here is a do-itvourself version of Mimi's Café Corn Chowder from Todd Wilbur's "Top Secret Restaurant Recipes" book. Make a batch and freeze individual portions in small containers. Alas, you'll still have to go to Mimi's for those yummy muffins!

Mimi's Café Corn Chowder Makes 8 1-cup servings

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 large celery stalks, chopped (about 11/2 cups)
- 1/2 cup diced white onion 4 cups water
- 1 russet potato, peeled and cut into 1/2-inch cubes (about 2 cups)
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 15-ounce can creamstyle corn with liquid
- 1 15-ounce whole kernel corn with liquid
- 2 teaspoons granulated sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon ground white pepper
- ½ cup flour
- 11/2 cups half and half Minced fresh parsley
- 1. Sauté celery and onion in butter for 5 minutes in large pan or stock pot. Do not brown.
- 2. Add water, potato and bay leaf. Bring to boil, then reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 3. Add creamed corn with liquid, canned whole corn with liquid, sugar, salt and white pepper. Simmer for 20 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 4. Combine flour with half-and-half and stir until smooth. Add this mixture to soup and simmer for 10 to 15 minutes, until thick.
- 5. Spoon a 1-cup portion into a bowl and sprinkle parsley on top.

Vested title in real estate

The following is a description of some of the different methods that title can be held in real estate:

Sole Ownership — is described as ownership by one individual or person. A typical sole ownership description would be Jane Smith, a single woman; Jane Smith, an unmarried woman: James Smith, a married man as his sole and separate property.

Joint Tenancy — is a manner of vesting title to two or more individuals who own real estate in equal shares or interest and subject to the rights of survivorship. Upon the death of one party, title is automatically vested to the surviving joint tenants. A joint tenant cannot will his ownership to another individual.

learning a new computer program or taking music lessons.

There are also simple exercises that don't require a book, computer or even pen and paper.

Try this: While waiting in line at the bank, count to 100 by factors of three. If that's too easy, then go backward. Run through the multiplication and division tables in your head.

Had your fill of math? Then move on to language. Say the alphabet backward. How many names can you think of that start with the letter A? Can you name 10 things that start with the letter D?

Whatever activities you choose, make sure that you have to work your brain, causing it to be used in non-routine ways. This stretching process will help create stronger memories that will provide for clearer overall thinking.
