Red Ribbon Flags switched to OK signs

The Emergency Preparedness Organization, or EPO, formerly ESO, is discontinuing the use of Red Ribbon Flags on Velcro as the "All OK" in disaster drills (DPX) and emergencies.

Instead, we will soon distribute to you a bright yellow "OK" sign. These signs come with emergency preparedness hints on the reverse and are securely covered in page protectors.

During a disaster drill, your Village Coordinator or alternate will look for this yellow sign in your front window. It can also be posted in a side window if you don't have a

front window, or taped on your front door.

We feel this change will do away with problems such as failing Velcro, flyaway flags and missing flags when residents move. Most Villagers will not even have to leave the comfort of home to display their yellow "OK" so it's visible from the street.

The signs should not be left on display indefinitely, because a situation might occur when help would be needed, and the sign would delay or prevent receiving it.

After a drill is completed or an emergency has passed, please remove and save the yellow "OK" for future use.

Award-winning LV chili recipe

While we don't have the 2008 recipe yet, in 2007, the winner of the Leisure Village Chili Contest was Stan Bryer, Village 17, a wonderful writer, storyteller and cook.

Have you ever heard of coffee in chili? Me, neither! But wait till you taste it!

You can use dried beans, but be sure to soak them overnight and then

Stan's Mild Smokey Trail Chili Serves 10

½ lb. canned kidney beans (rinse and drain)
2½ lbs. prime top sirloin (freeze slightly for

easier cutting)
2 large sweet onions,

chopped
4 cloves of pressed garlic
2 T. Masa (corn) flour
10 drops mild green
Tabasco sauce
1 chopped green pepper
8 T. chili powder
½ cup strong coffee
3 cups beef broth
Salt and pepper to taste
1 cup chopped tomatoes
and juice
2 T. Vegetable oil


1. Put prepared beans in bottom of large pot under low heat. Mix chili powder into coffee and set aside. Add chili or other spices to taste.

2. In pan, saute onions. Add garlic, tomatoes, green pepper and braise till all is tender. Be careful not to burn the garlic. Simmer on low heat for 10 minutes. Add to beans and simmer.

3. Trim fat off and cut meat into sugar size cubes. Put oil in pan and heat medium high. Add meat and brown on all sides. Turn down heat and stir meat for 15 minutes.

4. Add meat to the bean mixture. Add coffee chili mixture and beef broth to cover the meat. Simmer partially covered for 1½ hours or until meat is tender. Stir occasionally and add water as needed. Thicken with corn flour. Add salt, pepper, and mild Tabasco to taste.

Stan serves with sides of raw chopped onion and grated cheddar cheese!



Analog's demise won't affect LV

A lot of talk is going around regarding the national television changeover that will happen early this year. That's when all "local" television stations will change from analog to digital signals.

What I have found, however, is that many people are still very confused about what it will mean to us as viewers. The answer for us in Leisure Village is: Nothing!

That's because we get all of our television stations from our cable service, Time Warner. There are some here who use satellite services. There's nothing to worry about

there, either.

Basically, all of the stations we receive are "gathered" for us by the cable or satellite company and sent to us in a "package." Local broadcast stations from Los Angeles are included, along with our LVTV and the Camarillo Public Service Channel and various cable channels. When the local channels in our package make the changeover, the cable company will take care of the transition for us and continue to send us everything we're getting right now. We won't have to do a thing. Isn't that nice?

All I can add to this is: Keep watching LVTV on Channel 25 and 995!

Feed your body, brain

Weight management and good nutrition are both essential to good health. In fact, new medical evidence indicates that a poor diet contributes to brain cell damage — so what you feed your body directly affects your brain.

A "brain healthy" diet means low-fat, low-cholesterol choices combined with an abundance of antioxidant foods. Eat fresh foods rather than highly processed foods. Drink plenty of fluids - six 8-oz. glasses a day - and make sure that a good portion is water. Limit caffeine and alcohol. Include colorful fruits and vegetables in your diet, and strive for at least four or five servings

Choose foods such as kale, spinach, Brussels sprouts, alfalfa sprouts, broccoli, beets, red bell

pepper, onion, corn, eggplant and dark lettuces.

Fruits with high antioxidant levels include prunes, raisins, berries, plums, oranges, red grapes and cherries. In moderation, some nuts - like almonds, pecans and walnuts - can be a good source of vitamin E, an antioxidant. Foods like tomatoes, tomato products and V8 juice are good.

Opt for proteins found in cold-water fish, like tuna, wild salmon, herring, sardines and whitefish. And reduce saturated fats such as red meats and animal products.

The goal is to have a healthier body and mind. Your brain will benefit from a well-balanced diet and better food choices.

his courses, they could add \$1 million to their lifetime earnings.

As a professor, Joe taught at the University of Redlands and later in the Engineering School at the University of California, Irvine. One of the courses he taught at Irvine was so much in demand that students would start lining up at midnight before registration opened in order to reserve a spot in his class. In recognition of Joe's dedication and commitment, in 1996 he received both the Outstanding Engineering Professor of the Year Award and Outstanding UCI Citizen of the Year Award

Earlier in his career. Joe was a high school

teacher. Twice he was recognized for his exceptional teaching skills with Teacher of the Year awards. After several years at the high school level. Joe became assistant superintendent for science curriculum in Westchester County, N.Y.

Joe always seemed to have a keen sense for the needs of his students. He saw that the science texts used in the classrooms were not up to date. He developed new textbooks that reflected the latest scientific research and discoveries.

Later in his career, he leveraged his classroom experience and developed innovative learning programs such as the New York Graphic miniMuseum, the Money Learning Program and the Sports

Illustrated Learning Program. The Sports Illustrated Learning Program was especially creative. It used sports to develop student skills in mathematics, reading, language arts and other subjects. For example, students learned how to solve math problems based on sports statistics.

In addition to education. Joe also has extensive experience in publishing. He worked 12 years as executive editor with General Learning Corporation, the publishing affiliate of General Electric and Time, Inc., in New York. He also served as editor of Time/Life Education.

Joe has combined his publishing and education expertise in one area that addresses a great need

for all people living in Southern California. He realized that there was a great deficiency in useful information on how to prepare for an earthquake. Joe did extensive research and then wrote a book on earthquake preparation. "What You Should Know About Earthquakes,' which is widely used in classrooms throughout Southern California. Joe has also written many newspaper columns about earthquakes and earthquake preparation in The Orange County Register.

At the age of 80, Joe is now retired and lives with his wife, Marilyn, in Village 30. Marilyn and Joe have been married for 52 years and have three children, Brett, Scott and Jill. Brett is the creative director of a television station

in London. Scott is a vice president of Research and Development at Amgen in Thousand Oaks, Julie is the administrative assistant to the chief librarian in Eugene, Ore. Marilyn, Joe's wife, has appeared in several plays at Leisure Village.

Professor Foraker. or Joe, has won more awards and has achieved more than could possibly be written in this short article. As he reflects on his career and his accomplishments, he certainly should know that there are many lives that he has touched and impacted in a positive way.
