With a perfect replica of the official letterhead of Bank of America, the e-mail stated that a computer glitch at her branch had "frozen" her account and that they were unable to unlock it to post any deposits or withdrawals. This resident called her bank and was informed that this scam, called "phishing," was familiar to

them, and they cautioned her that Bank of America never e-mails their customers unless replying to an inquiry.

Be forewarned, and never give any personal financial information in response to an e-mail.



Low in fat and bursting with antioxidants, tomatoes are now at their peak. Show them off for hors d'oeuvres or as an openface light-lunch sandwich with bruschetta, which is pronounced "brew-SKET-TA" by foodies. Use fresh or dried herbs.

Once you make bruschetta, you can refrigerate it for a few days to serve later in the week. You can also add some fresh or imitation crabmeat or leftover shredded cooked chicken with some grated mozzarella cheese on top to "kick it up a notch!" You can "cheat" and buy pretoasted crostini in stores such as Trader Joe's, but purists believe

that toasting your own bread is the way to go! However, I will never tell.

Fresh tomato bruschetta Serves 4

Ingredients:

- 8 ripe Roma or other small firm, ripe tomatoes, chopped
- 2 cloves garlie, minced 5 leaves fresh basil,
- chopped 1 pinch dried oregano 1/4 teaspoon tarragon
- 1 pinch salt
- 1 pinch pepper
- 1 pinch crushed red pep-
- 3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 loaf Italian or Ciabatta bread

In a large bowl, combine the tomatoes, basil, oregano, tarragon, olive oil and garlie. Mix thoroughly and add the salt and peppers. Refrigerate the mixture for about 15 minutes.

On a cutting board, slice the bread on an angle in very thin pieces. Preheat your broiler. On a baking sheet, line up your bread and brown the slices on each side. Spread the mixture on your toasted bread and prepare on a platter.

Serve immediately or refrigerate leftovers, or cut the ingredients in half and use a toaster oven to toast your bread slices for two servings.

have a daughter, Barbara, who is a bookkeeper.


Mort has had prostate cancer but has fortunately recovered from it.

From "FOR SALE" to "SOLD"

Sometimes a bargain costs more in the long run

This is a true story, told to me by the person to whom it happened.

On the day a friend of mine and his wife were moving away to another part of California, the husband did what some of us have done: He hired three day laborers. He found the men east of the Village, along Santa Rosa Road, at one of several spots frequented by those looking for work mostly in the nearby fields.

The man I'll call "S" did not know the men, but, apparently, the men knew one another. They followed him in their car to the shopping area out-

side the Village main gate, where they then got into his car for entry to the Village and immediately went to work.

At one point, early that morning, I dropped by. I saw that "S" had hired good, efficient workers. The household was quickly being moved into two trucks. The men were doing as "S" wanted, and his grasp of their language, and above-average pay, was making the move go smoothly.

But that is not what this story is about.

"S" is a "neat freak," cum laude, and while "neatening up" outside the house, he noticed a plastic cup full of soda under some bushes. He had provided soda with lunch for the men. And he assumed that one had filled the cup and forgotten it after their break.

As "S" was about to throw the soda out, he discovered the cup's unusual weight was caused by several valuable pieces of his wife's jewelry submerged under the soda.

Not uncommon while moving, "S" and his wife apparently had overlooked where they had stored or "hid" some valuables — in this case, a small bag of jewelry in an out-of-way corner of a bedroom closet.

When confronted with the find, none of the workers acknowledged seeing the jewelry, nor would they identify which man, if not all three, had concocted the now all-too-simple theft and cover-up.

"S" reported the incident to security, but, outnumbered, and not wanting to create a physical confrontation, he took the men to their car outside the gate, paid them and let them go.

This is a cautionary story. There is only one reason to report it: No matter the task, when we hire people we do not know, who present no verifiable references or documentation of their identity, we may get a bargain up front, but we also risk paying a bigger price at the end.

We must know who we hire to do anything around our homes. It is our job to check references and to vouch for the trustworthiness of those we bring into this community. When we make a mistake or cut the wrong corners, we aren't the only ones at risk — we put a big crack in that security that most of us say we feel secure in because we live in Leisure Village.



foreclosed properties here in Leisure Village.

As I wrote last month, if possible, a "short sale," where the lender agrees to accept less than the loan amount, is a better solution than the foreclosure process for both the homeowner and the lender.

Foreclosure is the most challenging issue against a security clearance outside of a conviction of a serious misdemeanor or felony. Employers have the right and are actively checking the credit of all employees who are in sensitive positions, as well as requiring credit checks on all job applicants. A foreclosure is one of the most detrimental credit items an applicant can have, and in most cases, it will challenge employment. In most states, the bank has the right to pursue a deficiency judgment.

A homeowner who loses a home to foreclosure is ineligible for a Fannie Mae-backed mortgage for a period of five years and an investor is ineligible for seven years. Credit scores may be lowered anywhere from 250 to more than 300 points and will typically affect the score for more than three years. Foreclosure will remain as a public record on a person's credit for 10 years or more.

It is wise to avoid the foreclosure process whenever possible by requesting a loan modification by the lender or talking to a Realtor about a potential "short sale."

Use baking soda to extinguish a grease fire

Thanks to eagle-eyed Lin Grant, I am happy to correct an error I made in my report last month about fighting grease fires in the kitchen. Among the recommendations, I reported that "baking powder" can be used to be put out a grease fire. Lin, who is a graduate chemist, points out that I should have said baking soda, not powder.

The good catch by Lin opens the way to note a few other kitchen safety items that I did not have space for in the previous article. These come from the University of Rochester's Environmental Health and Safety Department, which notes that 65 percent of all residential fires are related to the kitchen:

- Keep combustibles
 potholders, pizza
 boxes, plastic utensils,
 towels, etc. away from
 hot surfaces. Turn off all
 heat-generating appliances when not in use.
- Pot handles should not extend out from a kitchen stove or range.
- Don't leave spoons or other utensils in pots while cooking.
 - Keep curtains and

towel racks away from a stove or range.

 Keep sturdy oven mitts or potholders near the cooking area.

• Use only microwave-safe utensils in microwave ovens. Do not use metal or plastic products.

• The storage area above a stove or range should not contain any flammable or combustible items.

• For stove or range, the exhaust fan should be on while cooking.


• Clean vent filters regularly.

• It may be dangerous to attempt to put out a

grease fire with an extinguisher. An extinguishing agent released under pressure can spread a grease fire in a frying pan rather than put it out. Smother a grease fire by sliding a lid (or larger pot) over the pan or by spreading baking soda over the fire.

• Never use water, flour or baking powder to attempt to extinguish cooking fires. These may cause the fire to get larger or create an explosion.

• Never leave a stove or range unattended when cooking.
