
## Fall Sale set for Nov. 6 in Pavilion



## LV shows it's prepared for disaster

The August meeting of the Community Associations Institute (CAI) was singularly different. First of all, the subject matter was unusual: Emergency Preparedness. Instead of the usual speakers — suppliers of goods or services to community associations — three of the four speakers were none of these.

First was Laura Hernandez of the Ventura County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services, who spoke about what the county has done to respond to emergencies, including the Emergency Command Center at the County Government Center, and preparations individuals can make to be ready for the inevitable disasters that may affect our county.

She was followed by attorney David Swedelson, who discussed various legal aspects of homeowner associations setting up methods for responding to emergencies and possible liabilities that might arise from them.

Next, Battalion Chief Dave Chovanec of the Ventura County Fire Department spoke about CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) training and activities in the county. All CERT class instructors are VCFD professionals with expertise in emergency management, under grants from FEMA. He included a video describing how CERT-trained citizens might respond to an earthquake in their neighborhood.

Following Chovanec was your reporter. Leisure Village was chosen by CAI to give a homeowner association's perspective on emergency preparedness. I received a call from the program organizer, Linda White, inviting me to speak about Leisure Village and our emergency preparations. I was very pleased to have the opportunity to tout our little paradise in the CAI forum.

We took along a rather classy PowerPoint presentation and a display of posters and printed information that CAI graciously allowed space for. The graphics were supplied by the Recreation Office staff and were of excellent quality.

The talk covered as much as could be fit into the short time slot available, and included EPO/EPC organization, Communications, Emergency Supplies, CERT in the

Village, and the mobile Emergency Command trailer recently completed by the Security and Safety Department. This trailer was on display in the parking lot after the meeting for all to see. All in all, we tried to illustrate, in depth, the degree to which Leisure Village is prepared for possible disasters.

Finally, Swedelson described the legal aspects of CERT activities in homeowner associations, the Good Samaritan laws, and implications of liabilities that are pertinent when an association takes on responsibilities that may not be required by law. In addition to the LV board members, also present were Bob Scheaffer, general manager; Mary Hurt, assistant general manager; and Security Chief Manny Segovia. The LV EPO was represented by Loye Bohannon, Dr. Alan Caldwell, current EPO Chair Karen Dundas, Linda Fisher, Hanna Huber, Sharon Loney and Marge May.

A substantial amount of information was provided to the CAI members present, and a good amount of public relations currency was accumulated by LVA.







permanently," explains Committee Chair Bob Ellis.

Committee members emphasize that they are only investigating.

"We are not committing to anything. Nor are we on a timetable," explains Don Marquardt, who proposed the committee and serves as its liaison with the Village Board of Directors. "This is not about political things like global warming. This is simple: Are there alternative ways to produce electricity that would reduce our electric bill?"

Exploring green energy for the Recreation Center is the initial focus of the committee. Currently, the electric bill for that complex is \$6,000 a month. Is the building suitable for solar panels that transform sun power into electricity for a fraction of the cost? A representative of a solar design company recently told the committee that it is. Villagers asked questions about how much a system would cost, what it would look like

and how long it would last.

Inspiration for the Clean Energy Committee came from the successful reclaimed water project that transformed the Village's irrigation system into an award-winning environmental model. Also led by Bob Ellis, that process from investigation to approval and installation took years. It made Leisure Village a leader in California water conservation and has already dramatically cut costs.

"Clean energy also could bring value to the Village," says committee member and retired engineer Frank Seiden. "But no decisions can be made until all options - including wind and biomass - are explored.'

Eventually, members will produce reports and recommendations but will not make any energy decisions. That's the job of the Board of Directors.

Some committee members can't help looking ahead.

"I can visualize a display in the Rec Center," says Ivan Bjel, "that shows in real time just how much energy we're using and how much money we're saving."


