

Alliance Here Faces Yorty Red Probe

'Little Dies' Committee Plans to Flush Out Relief Communists

Records of the Sacramento local of the Workers Alliance may be subpoenaed for study by the assembly "little Dies" committee, Chairman Sam Yorty declared yesterday in revealing he plans to ask the legislature for an additional \$10,000 appropriation to expose communists in the state relief administration set-up.

Yorty, whose five-man committee has been holding hearings on Red activities in the Los Angeles county SRA on an appropriation of \$500, said yesterday it is imperative that all phases of communism in relief throughout the state be probed.

Cites Red Activity

He declared:

"I plan to ask the legislature for a \$10,000 appropriation to settle this question of communistic activity in relief for once and all.

"From what we already have dug up in Los Angeles county alone it is clear to me that the problem is statewide and is extremely serious."

If additional funds for the investigation are granted, the Sacramento local of the Workers Alliance would be one of the groups whose records would be subpoenaed, Yorty added.

Threatening Letter

He said he would "thoroughly investigate" the complaint of Assemblyman Chester F. Gannon of Sacramento, made on the floor of the assembly Thursday, that he had received a "threatening" letter from the Sacramento local of the Workers Alliance, demanding that "little Hatch act" provisions be eliminated from emergency SRA relief appropriations.
