But first, let's go back to the beginning.





Parkinson's presentation Jan. 9

"I was stunned," says Villager Alan Rosin, describing his reaction when the doctor told him last year that he had Parkinson's disease.

"I had no pain, and the clues were very subtle," he explains. "I had trouble stirring my cereal with my right arm. And there was a small tremor in my thumb occasionally. I figured I just needed some physical therapy."

When he mentioned it to his primary care physician, the doctor referred him to a neurologist.

"She did some simple tests and said 'You have Parkinson's.' It was a shock, but I'm glad I found out when I did," Alan adds as he heads out to an exercise class.

On Jan. 9, a free seminar, "Living with Parkinson's" will be held in Leisure Village in the MPR, presented by Kaiser Permanente and Community Memorial Hospital. Village residents will hear Dr. Marko Petrovic, a board-certified specialist in neurology and

neuromuscular medicine, speak and answer questions about the disease that affects 1 million Americans. The seminar begins at 1 p.m.; refreshments will be served, and handouts will be available.

Some 60,000 people are diagnosed with Parkinson's annually. Research indicates that the disease begins in the brain long before any symptoms appear. However, early diagnosis is important. Alan Rosin is emphatic: "It is crucial to know as early as possible. Regular exercise and medication have positive effects. I go to three Parkinson's exercise classes a week."

"Living with Parkinson's" is sponsored by Your Neighbors Care Group. It is the first of four health seminars scheduled for Leisure Villagers this year. The subsequent schedule is:

- Understanding Strokes: April 10.
- Joints, Feet and Mobility: July 19.
- Addressing Alzheimer's for the Patient and Caregiver: Oct. 9.

the home what we Realtors call "curb appeal."



Gaining weight is easy but dangerous; here's how to avoid it

It can be especially important to avoid being overweight, and especially obese, as we approach the senior years. A Journal of American Medicine study showed 70 percent of adults over the age of 60 are overweight or obese.

Seniors, when compared to younger adults, tend to gain weight for different reasons and in different ways. Being overweight or obese as a senior adult can cause and/or exacerbate serious conditions such as Type 2 diabetes, cardiovascular disease and osteoporosis. The lungs of obese patients decrease in size, making it easier to develop respiratory problems. Obese adults can develop pressure sores much more easily. Older adults who struggle with obesity also have higher rates of depression.

The risk of dying from weightrelated disease increases as people age. Some studies show overweight and obese senior adults are more likely to need nursing home care.

What causes senior adults to get overweight or obese?

- As muscle mass decreases over time, fat mass increases.
- Many seniors simply continue to eat the same amount of food as they did when they were younger, even though they're less active.
- Hormonal changes that occur as we age contribute to weight management. These hormonal changes in senior adults can contribute to an increase in fat mass.
- A change in metabolism in older adults contributes to quicker weight gain and slower weight loss.
- Our environment contributes to the chances of putting on weight as we age. Some seniors have less access to exercise and fitness centers.
- Our society's growing habit of eating out is a contributing factor.

When we eat out, we consume both more food and more food higher in fat than when we cook our meals at home.

What should seniors do to avoid obesity?

The facts about seniors with obesity are scary. But, there are a variety of things older adults can do to maintain a healthy weight.

- You should focus on not only modifications to eating and exercise, but also developing community support with others committed to maintaining a healthy weight.
- Routine physical activity that includes stretching, aerobics and strengthening exercises, even in the very old or frail elderly, is shown to help avoid obesity and its related chronic illnesses. Notably, you can gain as much physical benefit from three 10-minute exercise sessions as one for a total of 30 minutes.
- Talk with your doctor about the effects of your prescription drugs on

weight management, and get advice on the best way to address it.

- Getting enough sleep helps you burn more calories. And a lack of sleep also contributes to sleep-deprivation, and that leads to craving high-energy foods, which are often sweet or salty.
- Protein leads to healthy muscle development. If certain sources of protein, such as meat, are harder to eat, focus on other, softer sources of protein like yogurt or eggs.
- Consult a dietitian or your doctor before losing weight. For a number of reasons, diets that are recommended for younger adults can be dangerous and counterproductive in older adults.

Pillsbury Bake-Off leaves winner dough-eyed

For the first time ever, I went to the Pillsbury Bake-Off. I didn't go as a contestant. I went as a writer.

This year's bake-off took place at the Aria hotel in Las Vegas. My sister, a food writer from Baltimore, met me there, so we shared a room — and had a ball.

My favorite part was the final dinner at which they announced the winner. I meant to bring you guys a photo of the dessert: Glazed Dianduja Chocolate Bar with Vanilla Berries, but I ate it so fast I forgot to take a picture! Whoops! But I did look it up later and can tell you that "Dianduja" is an Italian chocolate mixed with hazelnut paste.

The final recipes were an amazing array of new and traditional—everything from Pastrami Melt on Crusty Pretzel Rolls to Sweet Chili Chicken Sliders. The grand prize winner got a million dollars — a lot of dough! (That was the joke of the night.)

Glorai Spriggs from Henderson, Nev., won it all for her "Loaded Potato Pinwheels." I did get to taste them, and they were delicious. This is an easy recipe and nothing says loving like a million dollar dish!

Loaded Potato Pinwheels

Ingredients

- 1 bag (11.8 oz.) Green Giant Seasoned Steamers™ frozen backyard grilled potatoes
- 1 ¼ cups finely shredded sharp Cheddar cheese (5 oz.)
- ½ cup cooked real bacon bits (from jar or package)
- 3 tablespoons milk
- 1 can Pillsbury Crescent Recipe Creations refrigerated seamless dough sheet
- 1/3 cup sour cream
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped green onion tops (3 medium)

Instructions

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Spray large cookie sheets with Crisco No-Stick Cooking Spray. Microwave frozen potatoes 3 to 4 minutes to thaw. In a medium bowl, with fork, mash potatoes, leaving some small pieces. Stir in cheese, 1/3 cup of the bacon bits and the milk until well blended.

Unroll dough on cutting board; press into 14-by-8-inch rectangle. Cut into 2 rectangles, 14-by-4-inch each. Spread half of the potato mixture on one rectangle to within ¼ inch of long edges. Starting at one long side, tightly roll up dough; pinch seams to seal. Using serrated knife, cut roll into 14 slices. Place slices, cut side up, on cookie sheet. Repeat with remaining dough and filling.

Bake 17 to 21 minutes or until golden brown. Immediately remove from cookie sheets to serving plate. Top each pinwheel with sour cream, remaining bacon bits and the green onions. Serve warm.





On this morning, one of their facilitators, Mary Marcouiller, was sitting on a stool surrounded by the group while she reviewed the Ventura County Star for interesting and relevant news. She also reported the noteworthy events planned in Camarillo for the coming weekend - holiday doings

On their calendar, it was noted that it was Frank Sinatra's birthday.

"Ladies," she asked, "how many of you had a crush on Frank Sinatra?"

Some chuckles were heard and a few hands went up.

"What songs do you remember he used to sing?"

"Strangers in the Night" and, of course, "I Did It My Way."

"Do you remember his movie 'From Here to Eternity?"

A Frank Sinatra CD was put on their player to continue the musical mood while the tables and chairs were reconfigured for the next exercise.

Next up was Velcro baseball. A large felt playing field was posted on an A-frame. Each participant was given five Velcro balls to toss onto the mat for scoring. Everyone laughed when the facilitator remarked that someone had just hit the scoreboard. When all was done, the women had caught up with the men and the final score ended with a tie of 6 to 6 each and a fair share of clapping for both sides. It was clear everyone was

having a good time.

With our life expectancy continuing to rise, many folks are finding the need for assistance either for themselves or members of their family. Locally, we are fortunate to have Club Camarillo, an adult day program located at the Camarillo Health Care District on Las Posas Road. Their program is designed to meet the needs for some with moderate dementia, cognitive frailties or physical disabilities in a safe and compassionate environment. It has been determined that seniors involved in these programs extend by 18 to 24 months the period of time they can maintain their independent living.

Dorothy Reed, who doesn't live in Leisure Village, has been attending Club Camarillo for four hours a day, four times a week, for eight years.

The facility is state-licensed and staffed by professionals who continuously train to provide safe and beneficial daily care for seniors. Transportation can be provided, and schedules for attendance are flexible: half-day, full-day, one to five days a week from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Cost varies depending on a number of elements.

Activities in the Adult Day Support Program are planned to encourage socialization and participation in a wide variety of events that include music, pet therapy, exercise, and arts and crafts. As part of their craft program, clients lovingly make special forget-me-not gifts to be delivered with Camarillo Health Care District's Home Delivered Meal Program to those who are unable to easily leave their homes.

As important as the benefits to those attending is the greatly needed break the caregivers receive. It can be a win-win situation for all involved. Adult day care affords a break from the stress and physical demands of providing round-the-

clock care. Caregivers can relax knowing their loved ones are in a compassionate environment, treated with dignity and respect and motivated mentally and physically.

They welcome volunteers for both pleasure and educational purposes. The center would be pleased to have any Leisure Village dance or singing groups entertain and creative or artistic residents teach a crafts class.

Participation in the Club Camarillo Adult Day Program is truly a community effort with involvement by many volunteer groups. Leisure Village's Libby Pierce has been playing piano there for 20 years — twice a month — and says she feels their love when they see her coming.

Their December calendar included a visit from a local kindergarten class, another win-win for all involved.

WHAT'S COOKIN' PART II

Ah, Ramen Noodle Soup! It's quick and easy comfort food beloved by young and old. If you don't have consommé, you can substitute chicken broth, but consommé is best. This soup freezes well, too. If you want extra to freeze or share, use 4 packs of the Ramen soup, but keep the amounts of the other ingredients the same. This is another great recipe from my sister, the cooking maven. She has never steered me wrong yet.

Ramen Asian Noodle Soup

2 to 4 pkgs Ramen chicken flavored soup.

A few drops of sesame oil
One small (8-ounce) can carrots,
drained and mashed

34 to 1 cup shredded cooked chicken 1 can of chicken consommé (If concentrated, add water according to can directions.)

Directions

Each packet of noodle soup calls for 2 cups of water, so boil enough water depending on how much soup you are making. Open the packages and put seasoning packet aside. Break the dry curly noodles into smaller pieces. Place the broken noodles in the boiling water and bring to a medium simmer, stirring occasionally, for about 3 to 4 minutes. Remove from heat. Add the seasoning packets and stir to dissolve. Add the chicken consommé and mashed carrots. Add cooked shredded chicken. Lastly add a few drops of sesame oil to taste, stirring well.



never lost it).

A jukebox provided tunes for the forerunner of the Saturday Night Dances. Their son Frank, who lived in Burbank at the time, built a bar so drinks could be sold at the dances.

"But the Village had to get a liquor license and keep meticulous records and that became too much work," she laughs. "So the bar was shut down, and BYOB was born."

They paid \$35,000 for their home in Village 11 near the Main Gate. Across the street were farm fields, lima beans and peppers mostly.

"You could see forever, and when the farmers sold the land, they let us take the vegetables until construction for Village 13 began," remembers Piff.

The first nine holes of the Golf Course were completed, and Nick had the honor of being the first person to tee off on Opening Day.

In those early months, there were no LV clubs until Piff was asked to form a Women's Club and become its president — a position she's held several times over the decades. The early settlers also started Bingo Nights, held in the MPR with paper cards and canned goods for prizes brought by the residents themselves.

Entertainment loomed large for these pioneer Villagers, who initially created the Belles of Harmony and the Happy Hoofers. In 1976, the Rhythmettes were formed. Forty neighbors — including Piff — danced and made music with kazoos, pots and pans, and any "instrument" one could come up with. Musicals and plays followed, produced and performed by Villagers. The playbills included "Showboat," "South Pacific" and "My Fair Lady." Piff says they all were big hits and paved the way for today's Players Guild.

She's almost as busy in her 91st year as she was in her 50s. Piff still plays Bingo every Wednesday, remains an active member of the
