The rental market here in Leisure Village has changed, as it has around the country.


With the larger amount of available homes and fewer actual tenants because of financial challenges, the monthly rental prices have been reduced. Potential tenants have more choices available, and they are demanding that properties be in very good condition and are negotiating rents.

Many owners have chosen to lease their home with the expectation of a higher selling price in the future. However, the actual dollars available after property tax, monthly homeowner association fees and maintenance do not allow for much monthly gain, if any.

Some landlords are offering a free month rent and are receptive to negotiating some upgrades like new kitchen appliances, lighting, carpet, paint, etc. It is sometimes a good idea to complete some upgrades to be more competitive and get the house leased. When it comes time to sell, the completed upgrades will help to attract a buyer.



Understanding real estate terminology

We in the real estate industry frequently use terms which are very familiar to us as Realtors, but we often forget that many of our clients would like to know what terms like "REO" and "short sale" actually

Here's a glossary of our terminology, which hopefully will help clarify them for you:

• REO - Real Estate Owned: This is the term for a property that has been taken back from the owner by the lender, acquired during the foreclosure process. When the lender reclaims the property, it becomes "Bank Owned" or REO. Therefore, when negotiating for the purchase of these properties, agents specializing in this demanding area of expertise deftly interface with buyers and

listing agents representing the bank to culminate an equitable sale. The banks know what the properties are worth, so they cannot necessarily be perceived as bargains. However, the banks do not want to be in the business of property ownership, so these sales are usually swift.

• Short sale: The recent economic downturn has forced the banking industry to liquidate a large inventory of homes, which have been acquired via foreclosure or, more recently, through a process referred to as "short sale." A short sale is one in which the outstanding loan balance is negotiated between the seller and the lender, with the buyer paying a price which covers the new loan payoff and costs involved. The Short Sale Negotiator is the interface between the seller and the lender, who helps settle the

final amount of the loan balance the bank is willing to accept as a payoff of the loan in lieu of the original. substantially higher amount. The process of negotiating the loan amount and all pertinent terms requires substantial time, patience and literally hundreds of phone calls. This process requires knowledge of escrow procedures, loan processing and real estate law.

Fortunately, the sale of bankowned or short sale properties here in Leisure Village has been less common than in other areas. However, they do exist, and it helps for everyone to understand what these terms mean.







at each address, including name, age, gender, race and other relevant data.

The big question is: How do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist?

BBB offers the following advice: If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home.

Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census.

Remember: No matter what they ask, you really only need to tell them how many people live at your address.

While the Census Bureau might ask for basic financial information, such as a salary range, you don't have to answer anything at all about your financial situation. The Census Bureau will not ask for Social Security, bank account or credit card numbers, nor will employees solicit donations. Anyone asking for that information is not with the Census Bureau.

And remember, the Census Bureau has decided not to work with ACORN on gathering this information. No ACORN worker should approach you saying he or she is with the Census Bureau.

Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail or in person at home. However, the Census Bureau will not contact you by e-mail, so be on the lookout for e-mail scams impersonating the Census.

Never click on a link or open any attachments in an e-mail that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.

The Thursday Night Social in the Billiard Room typically has a great turnout. John Wirtz patiently gives pool lessons to beginners and new members on Thursday nights.




