Disaster drill May 20; put OK sign in window

Beginning at 10 a.m. on Thursday, May 20, residents are requested to place their yellow OK sign in their windows facing (or near) the street. This is part of the Disaster Preparedness Exercise (DPX) to insure all emergency procedures and supplies are complete, current and easily retrievable.

EPO volunteers will be checking each residence for the OK signs, and if the sign is not displayed, they will check to determine if assistance is needed.

In addition, they will be

available to check that radios, flashlights, and emergency kits are in order and for out-of-date batteries, water, food and other time-sensitive items in each home. They will also check for unsafe conditions in the home and will update emergency evacuation plans and prepare

a communications tree (family agreed-upon contacts out of the area) if needed.


Candidates Night is May 20

2 clubs join for unique event




After several residents were disappointed about not having a class in April, we will try it again in May.

As we all get a little older, better breathing techniques become more important. Hope to see you the second Wednesday of May at 10 a.m. in the Sun Room








May 12, from 1 to 3 p.m. On these dates tickets will be sold for members and their guests.

Selling? Condition, location, price are key

Condition, location and price are the three most important considerations should you be thinking about when selling your home.

A potential buyer will be looking at what upgrades, if any, have been made to your home and how recently. Upgrades that were completed years ago are often no longer up to date and may also show wear from years of the seller's use and enjoyment. Sellers will sometimes spend money for upgrades


